#### Friday, August 29, 2025

Fly to Europe—parking will be available at Morgantown, Pa., where a chartered bus will take us to the airport to begin this memorable journey! Others may fly direct to the Philadelphia Airport.

## Saturday, August 30, 2025

After flying all night (seven and one-half hours), we arrive at Zurich, Switzerland to step foot on European soil! Boarding our chartered bus—our home for the next ten days—we head west for the Lenzburg Castle—one of the oldest castles in Switzerland. This is the region where our ancestor Heinrich Frey's father, Jakob, was listed as a Lenzburger on his marriage record. Our first lunch in Europe will be at Lenzburg along the same streets where some of Jakob's relatives migrated to centuries ago. Then it is on to Gontenschwil where our Frey ancestors lived from 1500 to 1656.

#### Sunday, August 31, 2025

This morning we will visit the Gontenschwil Reformed Church where our ancestors worshipped in the 1500s and 1600s. Today, we hope to join with our Swiss Frey cousins for an International Frey Reunion and learn more about this area where our ancestors lived.



# Monday, September 1, 2025

This morning, our first stop is at the Frey Chocolate Factory that was begun by brothers Max and Robert Frey in 1887. Delicious Swiss chocolate with our surname on it! Then we are on our way to the city of Lucerne in Canton Lucerne where the Freys are thought to have lived prior to 1500. Our lunch stop will be in Luzerne—the first city in the Swiss Confederacy—where the fa-

mous wooden chapel bridge dating to 1333 welcomes us with its painted gables. Then we will enjoy an exhilarating drive through the Susten Pass before arriving at Brienz to sleep along a lake.





#### Tuesday, September 2, 2025

Our visit this morning will be at the Ballenberg (open air museum)—the "Williamsburg of Switzerland"—a delightful stroll through the past. More than 100 century-old buildings from all over Switzerland, 250 farmyard animals, traditional, old-time gardens and fields, demonstrations of local crafts and other special events create a vivid impression of rural life in days gone by. Then, we will drive to Beatenberg where we will ride a cable car up to the Niederhorn to see amazing views of the Eiger, Mönck, and Jungfrau Mountain peaks! This evening, we will enjoy our own private alphorn concert before a delicious cheese fondue dinner.

#### Wednesday, September 3, 2025

After driving down the steep narrow road from Beatenberg, we will continue into the Emmental Valley to stop first at the Barau Cowbell Factory to purchase a cowbell! Then a little further on, we will stop at the Kambly Swiss Cookie Factory where we will sample different Swiss cookies—all free—but first enjoy either a

sandwich or delicious homemade soup for lunch. Then it is on to the Jakob Markt where the locals shop—wait till you see the beautiful Swiss lace and other Swiss products that is the perfect place to do some shopping. To give us an introduction into our Anabaptist history, we will stop to see the old Trachselwald Castle built in 1200 A.D. where Anabaptists were imprisoned. The prison cells that were there in the 1500s and 1600s can be seen yet today. Then a visit to the Emmentaler Schaukäserei (cheese factory) will give us the opportunity to sample Swiss cheese.


# Thursday, September 4, 2025

Before leaving Switzerland today, we will stop at Hinterwil where Heinrich Frey's mother's family (Hirtzeller/Hertzler) was from and then a stop at Augusta Raurica—an old Roman town and fort along the Rhine River, built to keep the Germanic Alemanni tribesmen out of Switzerland. These ruins are surprisingly still intact. We highly recommend that you taste the delicious *Flamenkuchen* for lunch here before leaving for Germany. Then we have an


afternoon drive up to Altenheim, Germany, where Heinrich Frey was born in Baden-Baden along the Rhine River.

# Friday, September 5, 2025

This morning we will spend more time exploring the region walking the streets where our ancestors walked and worked and lived. A short drive across the Rhine River will take us into the French city of Strasbourg where many religious dissenters and refugees were welcomed in the 1600s. We will enjoy walking through the streets of La Petite France in Strasbourg. Keep looking up—you just may see a stork or two flying around and landing on the house tops! Then we drive on to Worms, Germany, to tour the famed Worms Cathedral and see the Martin Luther monument surrounded by the main forerunners of the Reformation: Martin Luther, Peter Waldo, John Wycliffe, Jan Hus, and Girolamo Savonarola.

# Saturday, September 6, 2025

Today is a special day as we ride on a ship down the Rhine River like our ancestors did centuries ago on their way to Altenheim. See a different castle around every curve—castles where our ancestors had to stop to pay a toll! We get off at Bingen, Germany, and drive through more vineyard country in Germany.



# Sunday, September 7,2025

This morning we enjoy a scenic drive through the Black Forest region of Germany and stop for shopping in cuckoo clock country! A hike along a dazzling waterfalls with an abundance of squirrels will be just the ticket for exercise before continuing on

#### - TOUR FEATURES AND CONDITIONS -

TOUR PRICE: \$4,600.00 per person based on double occupancy (add \$600 for a single room). A chartered bus from Morgantown will be available to transport persons to and from the airport. Vehicles may be parked cost-free at Masthof (Morgantown, Pa.) while we are in Europe. The projected cost for bus transportation to and from the airport will be about \$60 roundtrip per person (depends on the number of persons).

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Airfare and USA departure tax included in tour price (excludes insurance).

MEALS: Continental breakfast each morning and dinner each evening (excludes beverages) are provided. Lunches are on our own, although suggestions will be given.

BAGGAGE: Motorcoach capacity limits tour participants to one large suitcase per person plus a carry-on bag, so only one large suitcase plus "underseat" baggage, **please**. Airline baggage limits apply to the tour: luggage may not exceed a combined length, width, and height of 106 inches provided no bag exceeds 62 inches in width. The carry-on bag total dimensions limit is 45 inches, and cannot weigh more than 50 pounds.

SIGHTSEEING AND ENTRANCE FEES: Entrance fees are included to all places mentioned in this itinerary.

TIPS AND TAXES: Applicable taxes and service charges for program features are included. All tips to hotel staff for included services and meals and to bus driver are included.

NOT INCLUDED: Passport fee, travel insurance if your situation deems necessary, meals at noontime, beverages with included dinners, and personal expenses are not included. Details on the use of credit card and using the country's currency will be provided closer to our departure.

DEPOSIT AND PAYMENTS: A deposit of \$500.00 per person is requested by February 1, 2025, to hold space on this tour. The remaining \$4,100 will be due on or before June 1, 2025, as space permits [installment plans after March 1 are available as needed]. Pending availability, reservations will be accepted after June 1, 2025, although the cost of the airline ticket portion of the tour price may increase.

CANCELLATION CONDITIONS: Full refund granted if cancellation is received before airline tickets are purchased. Cancellation after airline tickets are purchased will result in a full refund less airline ticket cost (although the airline usually grants a voucher that can be used later).

A valid passport is required. If you do not have a passport, you should apply for one immediately. If you have a passport, please verify that it is valid until at least December 31, 2025. No visa is required.
