One of my big things is combining traditional genealogical research with autosomal and Y-DNA analysis. One of the issues with this type of work is how can whatever you learn be easily disseminated to the world at large (without writing a book!).

Besides the issue of how does one control what information is put out there, another problem with traditional means of genealogical research is that most "systems" do not work well in a team environment. The result is that everyone works on their own individual trees and sharing information practically takes a devine act.

The software used on http://www.shepler-shipler.com/ resolves those problems and many people may be on-line working at the same time.

I do work with a small group of people from around the country who are all Shepler/Shipler or descendants of. I would like to offer our database to any of your members who might be interested in its use. If the user does not wish to share certain information, they simply decide not to share it.

That last sentence reminds me of what I have scattered. Some wish that I had done a little gathering after this incident. - **Dan**

I was raised on the farm and we raised hogs, chickens, and a few cows and horses. My dad purchased a great tool to save time when cleaning the stables and hog pens. Dad bought a "NEW IDEA MANURE SPREADER". We pulled it behind the tractor and hauled the fertilizer from the farm. over to the alfalfa fields or other fields, and spread it over the ground. spreader had a mechanical conveyor on the floor and pushed the contents to the rear and into a pick up reel and threw it into the You have heard the expression "When the S--- Hits the Fan".

One day, I had a big load of stuff that was pretty soupy and very odorous. I headed over across to the other side of the town to spread the load. On the way, I had to go through the main intersection of town. The bank was on one corner, the drug store, the Super Market, and the hotel were on the other three corners.

At the intersection, there was a cast iron "stop sign" built into the center of the intersection approach. I slowed down and looked for traffic and pulled on through the intersection. One of the drive wheels on the spreader hit the stop sign and kicked it into gear. I couldn't stop, and covered the whole intersection with a flavorful mix of "you know what".

I was never welcome to come through that part of town again. Even weeks later, If the humidity was high or we had a little rain, the smell revived accordingly. There are probably still a few residents there that remember the "Frye Farms" and especially the one they call **That Damn Frye**.

Frances Adams Unger 1917 - 2017



Frances Adams Unger, age 100, died peacefully on Saturday, February 18, 2017. She was born on January 26, 1917 in Gainesboro, VA to Ernest Washington Adams, Sr. and Mary Virginia Larrick Adams.

Frances married **Vernon B. Unger** on December 7, 1940 in Jefferson County, MD at the Lutheran Parsonage. Vernon died on June 27, 1993. She was his faithful caregiver until the very end. Frances and Vernon had one daughter, **Frances** (Fran – Beekee) **Unger Ring**, (husband Tom). Two grandchildren, **Julie K. Ring** of Stephens City, and **Matthew T. Ring** (wife Hannah) of Tupelo, MS, and four precious greatgrandsons, **Matthew II, Tyler, Asher James** and **Myles** all of Tupelo.

Frances was a life-time member of Old Bethel United Methodist Church, the Albin Homemakers Club, the Fort Loudoun Chapter National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution and the Shenandoah Region Antique Car Club. She was honored in 2012 by the Fort Loudoun Chapter DAR as its first Honorary Regent. She was the oldest congregant of the Shenandoah Area Agency on Aging (Senior Center) and attended the Frederick County Center for 32 years.

As a young girl, Frances enjoyed exploring the hills of Gainesboro and making mud pies in Hogue Creek. She also knew how to work, helping her mother by cooking and making bread to feed the thrashers and other farm hands whom helped make hay in the summer. They also made their own soap, butchered their cattle, and washed their clothes on the washboard. Cleaning out the chicken coop was not a favorite chore. She was an active 4-H leader and loved to sew on her treadle sewing machine. She grew up with the Unger sisters, Evelyn, Hilda, Mary and Kate and was introduced to her future husband, Vernon, by knowing them. Frances and Vernon were married 52 years before he passed away.

Frances and Vernon worked very hard to make a living. They operated the Pure Oil Station in Winchester. Frances did inventory and kept the books for their station. Vernon also operated a trucking company and they owned and operated Unger's Angus House at Sunnyside in the 1950's – 1970's.

In 1943 when Vernon was drafted at age 32 and went to Germany for WWII, Frances worked at Woolworth's in Winchester. Frances and Vernon wrote to each other faithfully while he was overseas. They were apart for 36 months.

Frances was a loving care-giver to many. She had the gifts of mercy and hospitality. She loved to travel and planned coast to coast excursions to visit many "cousins" with whom she had connected. She had a great love for genealogy and her mind was full of information on family history. She was named for her aunt, Frances Belle Larrick Adams, and treasured the family information that Aunt Frances kept so beautifully. Frances and Vernon traveled to many areas

of the country in their antique cars. The 1927 Packard Touring car was their favorite. One memorable trip was to Plains, Georgia when Jimmy Carter was President of the United States. They participated in the Shenandoah Apple Blossom Parade and enjoyed taking celebrities in their antique cars.

The family wishes to thank all of her many friends and family who recently celebrated her 100th birthday, a very special milestone in her life.



My mother was always proud of the Frye name and I have so many Frye uncles and aunts who were the best. The Frye reunion here in Nashville was one of the most fun type reunions you could imagine as all seven Frye siblings and their families invaded someone's home with fun.

My grandfather, **Ewing Frye**, loved to hunt and fish growing up in the agricultural town of Gallatin north of Nashville and was able to do that with abandon. The Frye farm had an old house on it with a root cellar that I remember seeing as a kid.

He was a mechanic for the Nashville Bus Company and always was tinkering with engines. In his younger days he rode Indian motorcycles even trying to get the local police to chase him around the back roads of Sumner County. I did not know of anyone farther back than Ewing except his mother, Mary Myrtle Frye, who came to live with us for a short time. She was quiet and I really did not get to know her very well which I'm sorry for, but I was just a kid at the time.

Ewing like to garden and his gardens were big and full of produce. My mother was also resourceful as she had to be in the days of her youth even sewing her own prom dress.

Jessie Jean Frye, my mother was Miss Davidson County and 1st runner up Miss Tennessee and had a career in the music business in Nashville as executive secretary to **Buddy Killan** among many. She taught sewing for adult education and started her own company doing drapes. Her brothers and sisters lived good lives, some cattle farmed, others worked for wood product companies, real estate and building. They were all productive and good people.

I grew up without my father. He died at age 34. Mom raised four of us herself. I am a Master Plumber in the Nashville Area with my own company called Republic Plumbing. I am ordained in the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. **Leigh Ann** and I have five children and have been married over 30 years.

I take after my grandfather **Ewing Frye** and the Frye uncles as I love to hunt and fish and hike in Tennessee. The Frye family is one I claim as equally as I do the Ward family if not more as I take after the Fryes more than the other.

I was told the Frye family moved to Tennessee after the Civil War from Pennsylvania but There may have already been a Frye family located here and may be related. I look forward to knowing more about the history of my family.

Dr. Isaac Hite Baldwin

The following obituary was found on Find a Grave #107639705 for **Dr. Isaac Hite Baldwin**. He is the spouse of one of our cousins, **Mary Elizabeth Keckley**. However, if your ancestors include **Henry Speers** and **Regina Froman**, then you are part of the Hite family and can claim Dr. "Hite" as one of your ancestors as well. - Mike

He was called an "Old Country Doctor" by author **T.K. Cartmell. Dr. Baldwin** was born in Frederick County on 4 April 1813. Isaac, or "Hite" as he was known, graduated from the Pennsylvania Medical College of Philadelphia in 1834.

He came from a family-line of doctors; his parents were, **Dr. Cornelius E. Baldwin** and **Nelly Conway (Hite)** of Belle Grove Mansion in Virginia, the niece of **President James Madison**. His grandfather, **Dr. Cornelius Baldwin** had served in the American Revolution as a surgeon.

Dr. 'Hite' served in the military from 1837 to 1841 as an Assistant Surgeon during the Florida Seminole Wars (Tampa). In addition to his medical duties, he recorded meteorological observations for the military, which had suffered reoccurring losses from hurricanes. His notes have become the original records that several Florida counties use to mark the beginning of their official weather observations.

After he had settled back in Virginia, Dr. Hite married **Miss Mary Elizabeth Kackley** on May 23, 1847 with the **Rev. Lewis Eichelberger** as their minister. Mary (b.ca. 1823) was the daughter of War of 1812 Soldier, **Jacob Kackley III** and his wife **Leah (Clowser)**.

In 1848, Hite bought 32 acres along Froman's Run off Cedar Creek and his

practice (listed in 1851) was located near there with his fellow Drs. Sydnor and Cherry.

As the grandnephew of President James Madison on his mother's side of the family, Dr. Baldwin inherited a share of the two-part \$55,000 settlement that Dolley Madison received from the Library of Congress for her husband's Presidential papers.

His sister was **Mary Briscoe Baldwin**, the noted Missionary who served in Greece, Crete, and Palestine for over forty years. He was also cousin to **Mary Julia Baldwin**, on his father's side of the family, for whom Mary Baldwin College at Staunton, Virginia is named.

Dr. Baldwin passed away 4 Jan 1882 at the age of 69 years without having any children. His estate went to his wife's nephew after her death. 'Hite' was laid to rest in St. John's Lutheran Church Cemetery next to his wife's family relations. (HFFA visited St. John's in 2011 during the Winchester Reunion.)
