Hello from Frey Fort,

Here are many descendants of Heinrich Frey assembled in front of Frey Fort, built by Benjamin Frey ca. 1750. This photo was taken on Saturday, 21 May 2011 during the HFFA Reunion. Frey Fort is now the home of Chuck and Bev Veatch, who allowed us to visit their home, grounds, and the Frye Cemetery that still exists on their 140 acres. It was a special day for all. There were about 120 people visiting the Fort during the reunion.

We were divided into three groups each one taking turns touring the home, the grounds, and the cemetery. We all had some

expectations regarding the Fort. Through a succession of owners over the years, the house has been expanded and improved upon, especially by Chuck and Bev Veatch. The original Fort with its 26 inch thick walls, narrow windows originally used for defense against Indian attacks, and huge 8 ft. by 6 ft. oven used for cooking and heating are still intact. The "Fort" portion of the house now contains a beautiful sitting room, bedrooms, and basement. The additions to the house have kept the integrity of the original Fort in their design so that it all blends together into a beautiful and meaningful whole.

The grounds have become something that no one expected. Under the direction of Bev Veatch there has been a part-time and full-

time staff of ten gardeners who have brought much beauty to the grounds. From vegetables, fruits, flowers, shrubs, bushes, and trees, the outdoors area is like walking in the kind of garden you only get to see on TV or in a magazine. For those of us who enjoy landscaping and plants and gardens, it was worth the trip just to visit the grounds.

Across the road and up in the woods we found the Frey Cemetery. There were more headstones than most of us expected. In preparation for this reunion, Gordon Fry sent the following description of the burial grounds:

The Frye graveyard is located on wooded hillside approx. 3/4 mile West of the junction of State routes 606 and 623 and 200 yards SSW of "Indian Rock" on Rt. 606. The Frye Fort homestead is 1000 feet due North of the cemetery immediately adjacent to Cedar Creek. Graveyard measures approx. 90 feet square and contains an estimated 20 graves.

While the tour of Frey Fort was the main attraction of the reunion, our hosts Norm and Joan Schulze filled every day from Thursday thru Saturday with interesting speakers, interesting places to visit, and some memorable events to make this reunion a real high point in HFFA history.

In brief, there was the archivist, Becky Ebert, from the Handley Library in Winchester, presentations by Jon Frye and Anne Pasioka, a slide show presentation about our German heritage by Norm Schulze as he followed the Germanic roots of Heinrich Frey as well as his history in the Philadelphia area of Pennsylvania.

We met Bill Triplett, a life-long resident and historian of Winchester. He is an unforgettable character. New HFFA member David Look spoke about the French and Indian War. Our dinner speaker, Mike Foreman, is another area historian. He entertained us with his talk.

On Friday, most of us hopped aboard two buses that took us to Capon Springs, which were discovered by Henry Frye. While on the buses, we received narrated tours by Dutch Frye in one bus and his daughter Kennetha in the other.

Our next stop was the home of Irvin and Ann Heishman. Their home was built by Henry Westfall Frye in 1826. The adventures of getting into and out of the Heishman driveway could be the topic of an entire article. We'll just say that it took Irvin on a front end loader to solve the problem and free the buses, with the loss of his mailbox as a reward.

Lunch at the Historic Wayside Inn in Middletown, VA was a special experience in many ways. After lunch some people were able to visit another historic old house, the Hoffman House, a few doors away from the Inn.

We finished Friday with a tour of Belle Grove Plantation and a National Park Ranger presentation on the Battle of Cedar Creek and its importance leading up to the end of the Civil War.

Saturday was our day to visit Frey Fort. Many people came to the reunion for this event alone. It was as great as expected. The Veatch family has shown that they are good stewards of our family history and have maintained the Fort, the grounds, and the cemetery. We are fortunate that their ownership means a lot to them.

Lunch was at historic St. John's Lutheran Church. Frye family members have attended this church throughout its history. Most people walked through the cemetery next to the church and took photos.

We ended our excursion by visiting the grounds of the home of Ralph Frye. On the grounds there is a log cabin, an old one-room school house, and an ancient barn. The house and grounds have been owned by Ralph's ancestors for a couple of centuries. Another interesting aspect of this stop was the rattle snake that greeted us.

In the evening, many of us took a walking tour of Winchester led by ladies in old hoop skirts.

On Sunday, many took the time to attend services at St. John's church.

In my summary, I have undoubtedly left out some speakers, events, and other interesting side notes. It's not my intention to do so and I apologize. Overall, it was a great reunion, attended by about 120 people at one time or another. Thanks go to Norm and Joan Schulze for all they did to make this a memorable reunion.

This HFFA Newsletter has a lot to cover. Since the February issue we have had 15 more cousins join HFFA. I will not be able to list all their lineages in this issue so that I can save some space for other things. I promise to get to their stories in subsequent issues. We have some births, marriages, and deaths to report as well, along with some new addresses.

We had a general business meeting and our new secretary, Thelma McKenzie, has provided us with the minutes of that meeting.

Members are interested in HFFA finances and I'll try to make a meaningful report about the reunion as well as our Association.

Heinrich Frey Family Association Business Meeting

May 19, 2011

George Washington Hotel,
Winchester, VA

The meeting was called to order by President Gene Frye at 4:57 PM in the George Washington Ballroom. He welcomed all present and announced two officers had recently resigned their positions. Gordon Frye's resignation from the presidency was filled automatically by then Vice-President Gene Frye. Helen Staiger resigned as recording secretary after many years of service; Thelma McKenzie agreed to finish Helen's term. President Frye then introduced the other officers, directors and committee chairs.

Mike Speers read the minutes from the 2009 meeting in Mineola, TX. There were no additions or corrections offered.

Norm Schulze moved the minutes be approved as read. The motion was seconded, and it passed unanimously.

Treasurer Mike Speers reported there was \$9,526.21 in the checking account when he left home. Since then, more than \$1,040 had been collected in bus fees. The hotel charges had not yet been settled, and \$2,925 was owed for

the tour buses. A full accounting will be published in the upcoming newsletter.

Judy Fry moved the treasurer’s report be accepted as presented. The motion was seconded and passed without dissent.

Jon Frye presented several reasons for holding the 2013 reunion in St. Joseph, MO. There being no other suggested locations, it was decided to convene there in 2013.

Vic Johnson moved the nominations be closed. The motion was seconded; it passed unanimously.

Helen Craig then moved that one vote be cast for the entire slate. That motion was seconded; it was approved without dissent. President Frye then cast one vote and declared the slate elected. Norm Schulze described the activities scheduled for the rest of the day and

reminded everyone to be on time for the bus tours.

Jon Frye said there had been an effort in the 1990s to track the HFFA members who had served in World War II. We should continue to do so. Anne Pasieka suggested we also track those currently serving in the Armed Forces.

Mike Speers announced the past *HFFA Journals* would also be available after the bus tour the next day.

President Frye thanked Jon Frye, Mike Speers and Rosemary Speers for their journalistic efforts.

In response to questions from new members, Marti Frye described what information is in the *Links Book* and asked that corrections be sent to both *Links Book* Coordinator Wilbur Frye and her.

Norm Schulze then introduced Fannie Frey who gave a short remembrance of her husband, Jim.

There being no other business brought forward, Janet Goforth moved the meeting be adjourned. The motion was seconded; it passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:41 PM.

Patsy Cline was killed in an airplane crash on her return to Nashville, a few hours after her performance in my hometown of Kansas City, KS.

2013 Reunion: **Jon Frye** suggested St. Joseph, Missouri (40 miles north of Kansas City, MO) where the Pony Express Museum is located. "The first rider out of St. Joseph on April 3, 1860, was **Johnny Fry** -- a well known rider in local horse races." I didn't know our Jon Frye was that old!!
